FIRST TEAM - AUGUST RECAP

And after 20 minutes, the confidence only continued to grow as Green White had the better of the possession and created several good chances. The opening tally was nicely worked across the face of goal and knocked in from the eight yard line by Kyle Retzlaff off a feed from Justin Dugena. Unfortunately, the goal was given back 10 minutes later on a strike from in close. But Green White were not to be denied on this day. Still in the first half, Niko Voules came on as a substitute, and made an immediate impact. The young, second generation GW player found himself on the end of a flurry of blocked shots, including his own. But with no shortage of hustle, Voules chased down his turned away effort; put the closing defender on his back with a sliding tackle; and raced back toward the goal from whence he came. As he neared the target, Voules curled in a cross to pick out **Dugena** for the snapping header into the corner of the net. Later, GW nearly made it a two goal advantage, but the near post saved the blushes of the Zrinski keeper who took rather lightly a seemingly innocuous strike from distance

from **JP Reyes** that just missed the mark. In the second half, both teams had several good chances, and as the game wound to its conclusion **Dugena** rued a handful of near misses that would have closed out the game. But all was forgiven on the final whistle as GW walked away with the 2-1 victory and a rightful position at the head of the table.



HORST MELCHER (1936 - 2009)

ON AUGUST 11TH, 2009, GREEN WHITE S. C. LOST ONE OF THE GREAT ONES. IN THIS DAY AND AGE IT'S COMMON TO HEAR THAT SOMEONE HAS "DEDICATED HIS LIFE" TO SOMETHING, BUT IN HORST MELCHER'S CASE, THAT SAYING DOESN'T SEEM TO DO JUSTICE TO THE KIND OF DE-VOTION HE HAD FOR GREEN WHITE SOCCER CLUB. HORST'S CONNEC-TION TO GREEN WHITE ACTUALLY PRE-DATES THE CLUB'S CREATION. HE WAS A MEMBER OF THE DONAUSCHWABEN YOUTH GROUP FROM WHICH GREEN WHITE SPRUNG. HE JOINED THAT CULTURAL GROUP SHORTLY AFTER IMMIGRATING TO THE UNITED STATES IN 1949 (AT THE AGE OF 13). HE AND HIS DONAUSCHWABEN BUDDIES PLAYED SOCCER TOGETHER CASUALLY, AS THEY DID BACK IN THE OLD COUNTRY (THE GERMAN SPEAKING PARTS OF YUGOSLAVIA AND ROMANIA), BUT THEY LONGED TO DO IT MORE COMPETITIVELY. IN 1956, EIGHTEEN OF THOSE DEAR FRIENDS, WHO SHARED A COMMON HERITAGE, AND LOVE OF SOC-CER, FORMED GREEN WHITE SOCCER CLUB. THEY NEVER DREAMED IT WOULD GROW INTO WHAT IT HAS BECOME. HORST WAS THERE EVERY STEP OF THE WAY, HELPING TO SHAPE THE CLUB. FOR MORE THAN 50 YEARS, HE SERVED GREEN WHITE IN VIRTUALLY EVERY CAPACITY IMAGINABLE; AS A PLAYER, COACH, GENERAL MANAGER, SECRETARY, VICE PRESIDENT, YOUTH PRESIDENT, AND FOR MANY YEARS, CLUB PRESIDENT. HE WAS, ESSENTIALLY, THE FACE OF GREEN WHITE SOC-CER CLUB, AND THAT FACE WAS KNOWN BY EVERYONE IN THE SOCCER COMMUNITY. HIS WIFE OF MORE THAN 40 YEARS, HERTHA, HAS ALSO BEEN A VERY ACTIVE MEMBER IN THE CLUB, AND HIS CHILDREN, SONJA AND KURT WERE INDOCTRINATED AT BIRTH. BOTH KIDS PLAYED IN THE GREEN WHITE YOUTH PROGRAM AS SOON AS THEY WERE OLD ENOUGH. KURT WAS THE GOALIE OF THE GREEN WHITE MEN'S TEAM FOR MANY YEARS, BUT AS HE MENTIONED IN HIS FATHER'S EULOGY, DESPITE KURT'S OWN ACCOMPLISHMENTS, HE WAS ALWAYS REFERRED TO AS "HORST'S SEINE" (WHICH ROUGHLY TRANSLATES TO "HORST'S BOY"). KURT KNEW EVERYONE CONSIDERED THAT A COMPLIMENT. HORST'S CALM AND HUMBLE DEMEANOR; HIS KINDNESS, AND HIS ABIL-ITY TO TRULY CARE FOR OTHERS MADE HIM A WONDERFUL LEADER OF GREEN WHITE THROUGH TURBULENT TIMES. HE WAS ALWAYS THERE AT THE TOURNAMENTS, THE BOARD MEETINGS, THE DANCES AND EVENTS, AND HE ALWAYS GREETED EVERY MEMBER OF THE GREEN WHITE FAMILY WITH HIS READY SMILE. IT'S IMPOSSIBLE TO REMEMBER HORST WITHOUT THINKING OF THAT SMILE. CERTAINLY, HORST'S AC-COMPLISHMENTS WITH GREEN WHITE SHOULD BE NOTED. HE WAS IN-STRUMENTAL IN FOUNDING THE CLUB; IN CREATING THE YOUTH PRO-GRAM; IN MOVING THE CLUB TO MT. PROSPECT, AND FOSTERING A RE-LATIONSHIP WITH THE MT. PROSPECT PARK DISTRICT. HE HAS MEN-TORED COUNTLESS PLAYERS, COACHES, AND ADMINISTRATORS THROUGH THE YEARS. EVERYONE, IT SEEMS, HAS A HORST MELCHER STORY. HE TOUCHED ALL OF OUR LIVES. WE SALUTE HORST AND HIS DEDICATION TO HIS LIFE'S WORK (GREEN WHITE), BUT WE ALSO SA-LUTE HIM AS OUR DEAR FRIEND; A DECENT, CARING COMRADE. ON THAT LEVEL WE'VE SUFFERED A MUCH DEEPER LOSS. AND WE OFFER OUR DEEPEST CONDOLENCES TO HIS WONDERFUL FAMILY WHO HAS SUFFERED THE DEEPEST LOSS OF ALL. FOR THOUGH HORST DEVOTED HIS TIME AND EFFORT TO THE CLUB, HE WAS FIRST AND FOREMOST A DEDICATED FAMILY MAN - LOVING HUSBAND, FATHER, AND AS HE WOULD TELL EVERYONE HE MET, PROUD GRANDFATHER TO ALEX, ELLA & AUDREY. 







GREEN WHITE OVER 40 TEAM TAKES BARABOO TOURNAMENT BY STORM

While Art Caliskan and Greg Boltz deliberated over the free kick, the rest of the team flooded the box. **Boltz** ultimately took the kick, clearing the wall and the crowd to pick out the upper left 90. But the green team wanted more, and 19 year tournament veteran George Lymperis would not let this game pass without leaving his mark. Collecting the ball on the far side of the box, Lymperis weaved his way across the face of goal, strongarming exhausted defenders in his wake before finally, and mercifully, picking out the near corner to secure the 3-1 victory.

With the win, Green White finished group play on 6 points from a 2-1 record. But there remained one last game in group before the team would be certain of advancing to the tournament final. Green White needed Fichte Rams to either beat or tie "Milwaukee" in the last match, and half way through, Green White looked to be a shoe-in as Rams raced to a 4-1 lead. With just 15 minutes remaining, it seemed inconceivable that any team could score four unanswered in such a short period of time. But as Green White began warming up
